Around The College

- The residential houses at the Cabana Road entrance to the Windsor Campus are no longer there, and the Cabana road entrance to the campus is currently being enhanced to be more welcoming and visible.
- The new Gem residence is at capacity in accordance with provincial guidelines and is running smoothly.
- The Zekelman Business Tower is nearing completion and staff offices are currently operational.
- This year, St. Clair garnered two gold awards for Health and Safety and Mental Health Promotion and an Organizational Social Responsibility award.
- St. Clair College students living on the city's east side will have a much shorter bus ride to the South campus after the city and College agreed to share the cost of an express route on a trial basis. The \$180,000 cost to run the express route from September to December was evenly shared between the City of Windsor and St. Clair College. The new route from Tecumseh Mall to St. Clair College is about 20 minutes long, compared to the two-hour ride students previously had to endure.
- The Winter Convocation Ceremonies will take place at 2:00 pm on February 25, 2022. Due to COVID restrictions, the ceremonies will once again be delivered virtually.
- The Performing Arts Program has announced details for their Spring Performances:
 - o *Pelagie* is a Canadian musical, which focuses on the Acadian diaspora of 1756. After working twenty years in Georgia, Pelagie, a widow who was one of the many deported, decides to walk back with her family to her homeland. It is now 1776, and they must navigate through the American Revolution. Dates are April 21, 22 @ 7:30, April 23 @ 2:00 and 7:30.
 - o *Soundtrack* is a rock and roll review which examines the history of dance through popular music, beginning mid 20th century. Dates are April 28, 29 @ 7:30, and April 30 @ 2:00.
- Competitive video gaming -- also known as e-sports -- is a rapidly growing industry with amateur, collegiate, and professional levels of competition. St. Clair College is proud to be the first post-secondary institution in Canada to fully recognize and embrace e-sports with varsity teams and campus events.

Similar to traditional athletics, St. Clair players earn scholarships to compete in video gaming leagues against colleges and universities all around North America. The College provides a state of the art training facilities on campus and a dedicated staff of coaches that help players perform at the highest possible level. Reflections On The Pandemic

Nothing is lonelier than a pandemic. I live in an apartment building with 62 units and I very seldom see anyone. People used to meet and talk when they went to pick up their mail, but not anymore. We have 2 two chairs in the main lobby in front of the jail mailboxes. People used to sit there and talk with people picking up their mail or with people coming in and out of the building, but not anymore. We used to play euchre every Tuesday in our parish hall which is attached to the building. We have not done this for a year and a half. People used to meet in the laundry room, but not anymore. I go to church and I have to sit alone. I belong to the church choir, but we cannot sing in church, so I have lost that activity. I work at a golf course, but that will be closing soon, so I will be losing that outlet. I belong to 3 organizations that all meet virtually. As useful as virtual meetings are, they lack the warmth of in-person contact. Yes, it is contact with people, but not in person. I hear from my family by phone, but seldom see them physically. My son lives in B.C. so he is not available physically. My youngest daughter teaches kindergarten with 25 kids, so she is busy. My oldest daughter lives in Harrow and has just had surgery, and her husband is a semi-invalid. All my grandchildren, except 2 live out of town. I had a big disappointment in 2020. We were planning a big family birthday party. My youngest daughter turned 50. My older daughter turned 65, and I turned 90. However we had some small parties, but nothing like we had planned.

However, times are changing. I am the Retirees' Association's observer to the College Board of Governors, and I attended a live meeting on Tuesday (23 November) with 25 people in attendance. That was encouraging. Things are expected to open up in March, so I am looking forward to that; and that is just a few weeks away. Things could have been worse. I did not get sick. I survived my two vaccinations and booster, as well as my flu shot. I see the light at the end of the tunnel. I am looking forward to seeing my friends at meetings. I am looking forward to singing in the choir and attending church. I am looking forward to the end of the pandemic. ✨
