- Working effectively with students, the program team and a variety of internal and external stakeholders.

## The ideal candidate will meet or exceed the following qualifications:

Candidates must be a Licensed Veterinarian in the Province of Ontario and who is a graduate of a CVMA or AVMA accredited program. Candidates must also possess at least five years of recent work experience in a veterinary clinical practice. A strong laboratory background with surgical and medical experience in small animal practice, large animals and exotics is required. Preference will be given to candidates with previous experience in both classroom and clinical teaching.

Additional desirable skills include the following:

- Demonstrated experience teaching adult students at a post-secondary level;
- Demonstrated commitment to teaching and learning with both the desire and ability to actively engage students in an interactive learning environment;
- Excellent oral and written communication skills;
- Promotion of excellence in their field; Ability to work as a member of a team, willing to participate on Departmental and College Committees;
- Personal commitment to professional development, and;
- Excellent computer abilities including the utilization of computer programs
- Teaching experience at the post-secondary level with a demonstrated application of adult educational principles and teaching/assessment methodologies.
