



Ontario Remembrance Scholarship

To be awarded to a student pursuing a diploma/degree program of study, based on demonstrated financial need, academic achievement, and merit through community service and/or extra-curricular involvement. The scholarship is open to full-time domestic and international students.

On January 8, 2020, a Ukrainian airliner crashed near Tehran, Iran. Victims of the crash included 57 Canadians. Among the victims, 34 people were employed at or studying in universities and colleges in Ontario. In remembrance of the victims and to commemorate the talent that has been lost, Ontario through the Ministry of Colleges and Universities has established the Ontario Remembrance Scholarship. St. Clair College has been provided one dedicated scholarship for the 2024-2025 academic year.

If you are selected as the recipient of an Ontario Remembrance Scholarship, the personal information collected by the Ministry will include information on your program of study and year of study at the post-secondary institution, as well a brief rationale for your selection. The Ministry uses this personal information to administer the Ontario Remembrance Scholarship program, which includes planning or delivering the program, allocating resources, evaluating or monitoring the program, and detecting, monitoring and preventing fraud or any unauthorized receipts of services or benefits related to the program. If you are selected as the recipient of an Ontario Remembrance Scholarship and you have applied for OSAP assistance, the Ministry will also use your personal information for the purposes of administering OSAP.
