St. Clair College Board of Governors has announced the appointment of Michael Silvaggi as its 7th President. This appointment follows an extensive nationwide search conducted by the executive recruitment company of Odgers Berndtson, and it has been unanimously approved by the Board of Governors.

Michael Silvaggi will officially assume his new role as President on June 1, 2024.

Mike started at St. Clair College as a clerk in the Accounts Payable Department in November 2000. He progressed through various roles, including Associate Registrar, and Associate Vice President, Student Services and Registrar. In April 2022, Michael was appointed as the Vice President, Academic and Registrar.

Mike holds a Bachelor of Commerce (Honours Business Administration) from the University of Windsor and a Master of Adult Education from St. Francis Xavier University. And is a staunch advocate of St. Clair College's role in the community.

He believes in community engagement, and has actively supported local elementary and secondary schools through leadership and service, currently serving as a Board of Governor member at Assumption University and as a member of the Windsor-Essex Catholic District School Board's Parent Involvement Committee.

Present College President, Patti France, has previously announced her August 2024 retirement, receiving many awards and honours in recognition of her outstanding contributions to Windsor-Essex, Chatham-Kent, and the Ontario college system. **

The Saints Athletics Football Home Game & SCCRA "Tailgate" Event





College Administration Staff Association Makes Donation To College Scholarships

The St. Clair College Administration Staff Association ceased its operation in March of this year, after 40 years of activity – and, as it did so, it realized that it still had a considerable quantity of cash on-hand from membership dues and donations and other sources of revenue.


What should be done with that \$17,500?

Rather than somehow return it to the association's current and previous members, the group, instead, decided to invest it in the College's students.

On August 15, a get-together in the main lobby of the South Windsor campus saw the association announce that it was donating the contents of its treasury to St. Clair's Foundation to endow new scholarships for students.

And the College's administration matched that donation, pushing the gift to \$35,000.

Although administrators of the College still have an organization to discuss internal interests pertaining to the school, the Admin-

istration Staff Association had existed as part of a province-wide network to examine issues affecting postsecondary education in Ontario as a whole. That network no longer exists, so the St. Clair group wound down its operations this past spring.

Thanking the former association for its donation, St. Clair President Patti France said: '...hundreds of students who, based upon academic excellence and financial need, are annually helped by all sorts of donors: individuals, corporations, and organizations that have made a commitment, via our Foundation, to help St. Clair to help our Saints. And, now... the College's administrative staff – will be creating those appreciative smiles too."

- 1. On Tuesday, September 26, 2023, St. Clair College Board of Governors announced the appointment of Michael Silvaggi as its 7th President. (See article on page 3.
- 2. The final piece of the Dr. Patti France Community Promenade has arrived and has been installed at the Cabana Road entrance. The concept was created collaboratively by St. Clair College and



ROA Architects. The Griffin has landed.

- 3. After considerable discussion and review the decision has been made that there will be NO parking garage on campus due to cost. Additional parking lots are currently under construction.
- 4. The Ontario government is investing over \$650,000 to boost apprenticeship training at St. Clair College and help more people in Windsor / Essex get the skills to prepare for meaningful and well-paying careers in an in-demand industry.
- 5. St. Clair College and "Prep Doctors" have signed an agreement which will help foreign dentists learn the essentials of Canadian dental business practices while taking important steps toward earning equivalency from the National Dental Examination Board.
- 6. St. Clair College cleaned up at the annual National Association of Collegiate E-sports (NACE) Awards in Indianapolis, picking up 13 awards including being named Program of the Year. The awards were voted on by NACE member schools, which has grown to over 250 institutions this past year.
- 7. St Clair College President Patti France participated in the celebration and the unveiling of the Rosalie Trombley commemorative statue at the foot of McDougall Ave. President France joined recording artist Burton Cummings for this special event. Rosalie Trombley was the music director at CKLW Radio from 1968 to 1984. Her influence on the station's playlist and her ability to pick hit songs earned her the nickname "the girl with the golden ear."

- 8. The new College on-line store was announced previously. You can now shop the on-line apparel store at https://urstore.ca/st-clair-college for a wide selection of clothing, sportswear, merchandise, and accessories.
- 9. The intersection of Geraedts Drive and Cabana Road is now open, albeit still somewhat restricted.
- 10. Windsor-Essex Regional Chamber of Commerce has presented President Patti France with their 2023 Lifetime Achievement Award, another recognition added to a growing list as she moves toward retirement in August 2024. See article on page 15.
- 11. Nursing students studying in Chatham will no longer have to travel down Highway 401 to complete their degree thanks to a revised agreement between St. Clair College and the University of Windsor, following the signing of a memorandum of understanding (MOU) at the Chatham-Kent Health Alliance. This agreement allows students to complete the Bachelor of Science in Nursing program at St. Clair College's Chatham campus.
- 12. The St. Clair College Women's Softball team successfully defended their Canadian Collegiate Softball Association National Championship this weekend with a perfect 5-0 record. **

South Campus TV Studio – 50 Years And Fade To Black

This spring and summer 2023 brought to a close the complex at South Campus called the TV Studio. The last vestiges of the facility were demolished and the space cleared out to the walls after fifty years of operation to make way for a new IT department centre of operations.


The television studio was created in 1973 as a lab for Journalism, Advertising, and Theatre Arts students to provide hands-on experience in the broadcast television environment. It closely mimicked the various operations that would be found in a current television operation of the time including the main studio floor with its myriad of lights, backdrops and support equipment. The director's video control room, audio control and announce booth, video tape room, telecine film room, and like a real broadcast facility, Master Control where programs originating in the studio could be broadcast around the school, were installed.

Students in the Advertising program learned the intricacies of creating television and radio commercials. Journalism students produced newscasts. Theatre Arts studied lighting technique for television. By the mid to late '70s and into the '80s the Studio was busy with students thirty hours a week. This, after a TV Production elective was opened up to any College student, which proved to be a very popular course. The studio also originated a campus-wide daily information system that displayed College news on TV sets in key locations.

The TV Studio was initially built as a black and white television facility, the cost of colour TV equipment back then would have been prohibitive. For example a broad-

cast video tape recorder would have been around a quarter of a million dollars. So, the equipment build out was industrial grade that closely simulated the real thing.

By 1975, colour television recording equipment became more realistic in price and initially the facility started changing over to colour including video tape recorders, studio cameras and video switching and distribution gear.

Then in 1979, a conversion into contemporary video gear took place to accommodate a new group of users. Advertising and Journalism students moved to the new experience of colour television. Now students from other disciplines were requesting video projects in support of their instruction. As an example, students from the Architecture School were in teams assigned to record the stages of building a house, then produce a video of the process. School of Business students made their end of year sales presentations in a simulated site with

an audience and under the glare of TV lights after which they could critique their performance watching the video recordings. Other schools started to request similar services and thus video editing facilities were expanded, at one time five video edit suites were in operation.

By the time the studio went to colour television other production needs became apparent. Into the 1980's weekly College promotional television shows were created for the local cable TV broadcast. Learning videos were shot and edited for various schools around the College such as Electronics Technology, Dental Technician, Nursing, and Animal Care. One particularly successful project for the School of Nursing had a simulated

classroom set up in the studio where the professor lectured to the students while the lesson was videotaped. After the class, the videotape was copied to be available for students to take home for study parties to view the highly technical material. It was estimated that having that video material for review increased the average score of grades by about ten percent. All along, College Convocation sessions were recorded for local Cable TV broadcast use.

The next age for the TV Studio brought new broadcast equipment to replace the now worn out earlier technology. With the new gear, true broadcast quality programs could now be produced in house. And finally, around the year 2001 the studio entered the digital age with its first state of the art digital editing suite

By 2015, the majority of the audio and video facilities were removed leaving two edit suites and now room in the studio proper for the Theatre Performance program as a rehearsal hall and sound system testing room.

Finally, this spring the whole complex was removed out to the perimeter walls to make way for the new core operations centre for the IT department.

Thus, after fifty years of operation the South Campus Television Studio has now been given the final call. As they say in television at the end of a show, "Fade to Black". **

SCCRA E-mail System Change

At the end of August, our SCCRA e-mail broadcast service was changed from Campaigner (used since early 2020) over to Mailchimp (last used in late 2019).

Campaigner doubled their rates earlier this year, and with some other issues, we decided to make the change.

Our first go with Mailchimp was for their free version with limited features but this version has more features to work with. One feature added (if I set it right) is a confirmation e-mail if you should decide either on purpose or by accident to unsubscribe. (There were several accidental unsubscribes this past year.).

In a relatively simple process (thank goodness), more than 430 active members from the Campaigner database were imported into the Mailchimp user database.

Please note that about a dozen or so accounts that had unsubscribed, hard bounced (undeliverable), repeatedly soft-bounced, and/or otherwise had perpetual delivery problems were not migrated.

On August 30th, a broadcast announcing the change was transmitted to all the active members who had been migrated.

If you did not see the message, make sure that it is not sitting in a spam, junk, or trash folder. Otherwise, it is most likely that you are not in the new system.

If you found you did not receive the announcement, it is easy to 'fix'. Send your first and last name, current e-mail address, and your current municipality (so you will be in the right e-mail list – Windsor-Essex; Chatham-Kent; everywhere else) to SCCRetirees2018@gmail.com and I will manually add you to the appropriate list(s).

Re-subscribing scripts are not yet in place. Please note that for the time being, the Chrysler/SCCCA and Eatery101 lists will not be available. **




his retirement, he was the Department Head of Landscape Horticulture at St. Clair College.

Retiree Parking Permits For 2024

Your current SCC Retiree Parking permit **expires on December 31**, **2023.** Application for "Renewal" or for a "New Permit" will commence on November 16th 2023 and is an "on-line application".

Here are the steps involved to get this:

- 1. Contact Marilyn Portt to pay your membership. Wait a few days for her to get your info over to the Parking folks and for them to put your e-mail address on to their Parking Database. Marilyn will mail you your membership card.
- 2. Complete the application online and submit it. There is a 3-5 day waiting period to process your request at stclaircollege.ca/parking.
- 3. Pick up your parking pass at the Parking Desk. The Parking Department staff will require the applicant's e-mail address and verification of paid membership (your membership card) in the SCC Retirees Association for 2024.

Note: You will not be able to access the on-line parking process if you have not renewed your membership for 2024 or if your email address does not match what is currently in the Retiree Association records.

The Parking Department will allow someone else to pick up the permit or submit a completed application on a retirees behalf, provided they provide written authorization to the Parking Office at parking@stclaircollege.ca.

Remember - proof of membership is required when picking up your parking permit! You may send her your \$10.00 yearly fee by cheque or e-transfer. If you wish to be a member of OCRA (Ontario College Retirees Association) as well, the fee is \$20 for both.
