- 1. Starting this fall, the College is launching an Electric Vehicle Technician Program. It will be a two-year diploma program that includes a work placement in the third semester. After the first year, however, students will receive a certificate in Electric Vehicle Fundamentals and can enter an apprenticeship.
- 2. President Patti and the Senior Operating Group hosted a gathering of Essex County Mayors and Municipal CAOs where she outlined the College's strategic plan.
- 3. Construction on the South Campus continues with the building of a "one stop" Student Welcome Centre which will centralize services for students, making it as convenient as possible for students.
- 4. Outdoor pickleball courts soon to be available adjacent to the tennis facility.
- 5. The Multicultural Council of Windsor and Essex County (MCC) has announced this year's recipient of The Herb Gray Harmony Award, which recognizes individuals and groups who have made an outstanding contribution to building a more welcoming community for all in Windsor-Essex. The 2023 award was presented to **Dr. Patti France, President of St. Clair College.**
- 6. St. Clair College has been selected to host the Ontario Federation of School Esports Associations (OF-SEA) Provincial Rocket League High School Championship on May 13.
- 7. The annual Alumni of Distinction Awards will be presented on April 15 to: **Bob Bellacicco**, **Christine Knights**, **Fil Grado**, **Dan Janisse**, **Julia Lane**, and **Cheryl Sprague**.
- 8. The St. Clair College Saints have won the OCAA Men's Basketball championship. The St. Clair Saints defeated the George Brown Huskies 106-77. The win qualified the Saints to participate in the National Championship tournament in Calgary in March, where they placed fourth.
- 9. The College was proud to host the Hon. Filomena Tassi, Federal Minister of Development who came to Windsor in January to hold a roundtable discussion on Automobility.
- 10. The College held a part-time faculty recruitment night to recruit instructors in the fields of engineering and skilled trades. The event was well attended.
- 11. St. Clair College participated in a trip to Poland to tour the LG automobile battery manufacturing operation. St. Clair College currently offers numerous programs that will meet the outcomes desired in the new battery plant.

# Introducing Dale Jarrell Representing the Chatham Campus Retirees

Having retired in 2021, after 30 years full time at St. Clair College in Chatham, I look back and reflect on how fortunate I was to work at such a great campus and with so many wonderful people, some of whom have become like family to me.

I was born in Chatham but moved 8 times over the course of 16 years having lived in Leamington, Brantford (twice), Byron, Sudbury, and 3 times in Chatham to which I returned for the final time in 1968. My Dad was a manager for Canada Bread and as the company grew, transfers were common.

I went to high school in grade 9 at Confederation High School in Val Caron (Sudbury) and grades 10-12 at Chatham Kent Secondary School in Chatham, where I was in the Newspaper club, a cheerleader, and a gymnast. I received the Most Outstanding Gymnast Award in 1968, which by no means compares to today's gymnasts abilities, but it is something I am proud of and treasure.



I met Rick, my husband and the love of my life, in 1969. We had an amazing and wonderful life together for 50 years before his passing of cancer, 4 years ago in 2019. We have a beautiful daughter, Sheri, who graduated from the St. Clair College Nursing Program in her 40's and worked as a nurse till her cancer diagnosis in 2018. She is a remarkable and beautiful woman, and there are no words to express how extremely proud I am of what she has overcome. I am happy to say she is cancer free today. We also have a wonderful, handsome, and extremely talented son, Steve, who is a project manager for a restoration company. I have handsome twin grandsons, Hunter and Brodie who are 25, a beautiful 17-year-old granddaughter, Marin, and adorable 10-month-old great grandson, Tatum.

In 1987 I received two certificates in Fitness Training and have been teaching fitness classes for this my 36th year. A few of these remarkable women have been with me for those 36 years. This amazing group of women is like family, and we have been there for each other through good times and bad. Teaching fitness is a passion of mine and I will keep doing so until they have to pick me up off the floor!

I was the Team Co-coordinator for the MS Society Super cities Walk for 10 years, and am proud to say that the people I worked with at the College were always my biggest supporters when it came to making pledges. Many of them knew that my Mom was diagnosed in her early 20's and was in a nursing home at the age of 58 until her death in 2006. With the generous support and pledges from my family and friends, I am proud to say that over the course of my 10 years with the MS Society, I was able to raise more than \$20,000.00 for this very worthy charity so close to my heart.

I had a home daycare for 4 years when my children were younger before I decided to return to work. I worked at Pioneer Hi-Bred from 1980-1988 as a receptionist and in the mailroom until the company downsized.

Shortly after that, OMAF (Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food) hired me to conduct an extensive 4-month financial survey of greenhouse operations in Leamington.

Shortly after my contract with OMAF ended, I got a call back from Pioneer Hi-Bred who hired me to do data entry at their Ridgetown location. I was there for a short time until I received the call that a part time position was available in the print shop at the College. I also worked on the switchboard and as a receptionist at the North Forty Adult Education Program through Con-Ed.

The College hired me full time in 1991 working switchboard. When the opportunity came up, I applied for and got the full-time position in the print shop/mailroom where I worked until my retirement in June 2021.

Working at St. Clair College was one of the best times of my life where I met the most amazing people who I am proud to call my friends. I can honestly say that I loved every second of every minute of every hour of every day for 32 years.

# **Extended Health Care Improvements Announced**

The College Employer Council (CEC) announced enhancements to the Sun Life Extended Health Care Plans, **effective February 1, 2023**:

#### **Extended Health Care Plan 1**

• The limit under Paramedical services will increase from \$1,500 to \$2,000 per covered individual per calendar year, for all practitioners combined.

#### **Extended Health Care Plan 2**

• The limit under Paramedical services will increase from \$750 to \$1,000 per covered individual per calendar year, for all practitioners combined.

If you realize it's an OOPS moment, just close the message/window or go to the preferences option, and the unsubscribe will not go through.

If the request is successfully processed, and you change your mind, I cannot re-establish your connection; you have to do that on your own. If you find that you unsubscribed in error and want back in, send me an e-mail at <a href="mailto:secretirees2018@gmail.com">secretirees2018@gmail.com</a>, and I can send a command to Campaigner, which will trigger an e-mail to you to respond to in order to re-subscribe. When received, all you need to do is reply to it.

If you've gone through the request to me but you don't see the message within a short time, check other folders in your mailbox to see if the message fell into another folder. \*\*
