1. Peace Garden - A new peace sign monument has gone up at St. Clair College's main campus. The monument is set up in a newly created area with plenty of seating at the north end of the main building. Incoming president Mike Silvaggi said the administration wants visitors to the South Windsor campus to feel safe and included.



- 2. In partnership with the Friends of Willistead, on Saturday, Nov 18th the Interior Design students participated in the annual Christmas holiday decorating of the North and East Galleries at Willistead Manor. The relationship between St. Clair College and the Friends of Willistead has spanned over 20 years and is an opportunity for Interior Design students to work alongside a local Interior Designer or Decorator to prepare the Manor for the holidays.
- 3.St. Clair College bestowed an Honourary Honours Bachelor of Applied Arts in Social Justice and Legal Studies Degree to Mehari Hagos at the 56th Annual Winter Convocation on February 22nd. Announcing the award, Patti France stated, "For over a decade, he has dedicated his life personally and professionally to mentorship, advocacy, the delivery of life-lessons, and inspiring the youth of our community.
- 4. A team of St. Clair College students has triumphed over hundreds of teams from around the world to win a prestigious digital marketing competition hosted by Purdue University Northwest's College of Business. Competitors were asked to create a campaign for a new product called Sole Search an AirTag that locks onto a child's shoelace to keep track of their location. The St. Clair team was one of four finalists —out of 271 groups —to make their pitches in front of discerning judges and a global audience during the virtual Digital Marketing Competition & Summit.
- 5. St. Clair College has partnered with Habitat for Humanity to build sheds for geared-to-income housing. The students received hands on experience designing and constructing sheds for the community in need. Most lots on which Habitat builds would not have the space for a garage, and with an eye on economy, garage construction is a cost that they avoid. While seemingly small, an outdoor shed can play a crucial role, serving as storage for families to maintain their new homes effectively

6. The construction of the new Welcome Centre is progressing well. Located on the east end of the current building, the centre joins the current building adjacent to, and South of, the Classic Gym (Original gym). The centre will eventually house all services that a student may require when encountering an unfamiliar building – counselling services, financial services, admission and records, financial aids, to name but a few. There, one can find information about the CAAT Pension Plan, health benefits and health providers, websites of other retiree associations of other Ontario colleges, and a membership application form. Access to other Retiree Association newsletters can also be available.

### **Newsletter by E-mail or Snail Mail?**

The newsletter is distributed four times a year – on the third Wednesday of February, April, August and November. It is distributed to approximately 550 persons on our snail mail list via Canada Post. In addition, it is distributed via e-mail to approximately 415 retirees as well as to all College staff.

We are often asked why we send it both ways. The answer is that we have not had the ability to separate those who want only to receive it by e-mail.

## **Retiree Parking Permits For 2024**

Your 2023 SCC Retiree Parking permit **expired on December 31, 2023**. Application for "Renewal" or for a "New Permit" has commenced and is an "on-line application".

Here are the steps involved to get this:

- 1. Contact Marilyn Portt to pay your membership. Wait a few days for her to get your info over to the Parking folks and for them to put your e-mail address on to their Parking Database. Marilyn will mail you your membership card.
- 2. Complete the application online and submit it. There is a 3-5 day waiting period to process your request at stelaircollege. ca/parking.
- 3. \*\*Something New!! You can either pick up your parking tag at the Parking Desk, or you can request for them to mail it. The Parking Department staff will require the applicant's e-mail address and verification of paid membership (your membership card) in the SCC Retirees Association for 2024.

Note: You will not be able to access the online parking process if you have not renewed your membership for 2024 or if your email address does not match what is currently in the Retiree Association records.

Should you require assistance when completing your parking permit application, you can call the following numbers for help: Windsor - 519-972-2727 Ext 4515

Chatham - 519-354-9100 Ext 4515

The Parking Department will allow someone else to pick up the permit or submit a completed application on a retiree's behalf, provided they provide written authorization to the Parking Office at <a href="mailto:parking@stclaircollege.ca">parking@stclaircollege.ca</a>.

Remember - proof of membership is required when picking up your parking permit! To renew your membership or update your e-mail please contact our Membership Secretary, Marilyn Portt at <a href="mailto:mpportt@gmail.com">mpportt@gmail.com</a> (519) 969-0693. You may send her your \$10.00 yearly fee by cheque or e-transfer. If you wish to be a member of OCRA (Ontario College Retirees Association) as well, the fee is \$20 for both.

\*\*Please be advised that some parking permits were renewed and mailed out in December that were not properly completed. They are missing the sticker with the new expiry date (December 2024). If you received one of these in the mail, just bring it in to the parking office the next time you are there and the parking staff will take care of it. You do not have to go back outside right away to place it in your car. The parking staff will accommodate you to ensure you don't get ticketed that day and you can place it in your car when you return to your vehicle.

We remember the following Retirees/Full-time Staff who passed away during the period October 26, 2023 - January 31, 2024


